3a. Discussion Topics/ Presentations	<p>1. Dean Fixsen, Implementation Science – overview of core implementation components, what works to get new practices fully implemented.</p> <p>The purpose of Evidence Based Programs is to produce greater benefits for individuals and society. <b>The process has to lead to something.</b></p> <p>Often EBPs are not developed with fidelity requirements and the few projects done to fidelity are not sustained over the long term.</p> <p>Early decision makers must ask does the program have some level of performance assessment/fidelity assessment? We must be able to determine if the quality aspects are there, and to what extent.</p> <p>Without continuous fidelity assessments, successful EBP results can be nullified. If 20% of participants are using EBPs with fidelity and having success but another 80% are not following the EBP to fidelity, the results will appear unsuccessful unless there is an ability to assess fidelity of the EBP.</p> <p>Over time Dr. Fixsen and his colleagues have concluded that Implementation science is universal, applying to all industries/sectors.</p> <p><b>People do not benefit from interventions that they do not experience.</b> <i>If a fidelity program is proven to work, then it will only work if it is implemented to fidelity.</i> An Intervention (a serum) is only useful with Implementation (a syringe) and visa versa.</p> <p>Higher Fidelity= Higher Outcomes</p> <p>Norway has excellent implementation fidelity models...available through NIRN, just contact them. Ability to map one's organization, build on strengths, find holes</p> <p>2.
