Schools	The Casey Foundation has funded a Breakthough Series Collaborative(BCS) which is a partnership between youth, birth parents, data specialist, foster care worker and superintendent to improve educational continuity and school stability for kids in foster care. There are 226 kids in foster care in Catawba County in 3 school districts. Catawba Co. is one of 9 sites funded nationally as part of the BSC. The project uses a methodology to test change: Plan, Do, Study, Act.	
	 BSC in Catawba Co: Established foster care designees in every school Shared data between foster care and school system Negotiated transportation so students could remain in school of origin Captured information regarding student achievement in court reports Involved birth parents and youth in analyzing system needs 	
Video: Endless Dreams, Casey Foundation Discussion	Outcomes: 92% students in foster care during May 2008 had no school change 85% students demonstrated individual progress in at least one academic area of need 40% stakeholders have attended a training on school stability as a means of educational outcomes Established policy for information change New format for court reports that captures educational status.	
	Presenters played a portion of the videostudents regress academically 4-6 months with every school change -sleep problems occur frequently	
	Presenters fielded many questions from the group. We learned that the project does not currently address out-of-county residence but the project is working to expand. CFTs now happen within 5 days of an allegation instead of after placement. Project has a plan to blend funds to create a DSS Educational Liaison for kids in care.	
	We watched a slide show of a local Catawba Co. youth, Amber, who has benefitted from this project.	
	Nancy Carter reported that in 1998 SAYSO kids had a 47% graduation rate and now they have a 68% graduation rate.
