#### Will there be a State Budget Passed in 2021?

The State continues to work under an extension of budget amounts from the previous fiscal year as we wrap up the third month of State Fiscal Year 2021-2022. As we learned in 2019, a new budget is not always a given. But that leaves funding for any new initiatives or increased funding for existing initiatives on the table. At this point, there is a significant difference between the budget impasse of 2019 and the budget process for this year. The House, Senate and Governor have all agreed to work together this year to pass a compromise budget. That is to say that this is not a stalemate as it was in 2019...at this point. House Speaker Tim Moore told reporters that the House and Senate are close to finalizing a budget proposal that they will send to the Governor prior to publishing it for public review. This will allow the Governor and the NC General Assembly leaders to negotiate before the proposal undergoes legislative finalization. It is a strategy to avoid the veto and positioning to override the veto that plagued the 2019 process.

#### National Feedback Opportunity:

US Senators Ron Wyden and Mike Crapo, Chair and Ranking Member, respectively, of the Senate Committee on Finance, are asking for input from stakeholders on barriers to accessing mental health treatment and specifically to workforce, integration, coordination and access, parity and telehealth. Wyden and Crapo wrote <u>a letter</u> to their colleagues laying out a process to gather stakeholder input.
