## Deeper Dive into a New Law--Child Safety and Permanency:

<u>SL2021-132</u>, signed into law on September 1, tackles the issues of expediency in addressing a child's safety and permanent placement. It also contains provisions that relate to the adequacy of treatment and residential services for children and youth. On October 1, 2021, NCDHHS was required to submit a report to provide:

- (1) A description of the need and current adequacy of available resources across North Carolina.
- (2) Specific and measurable action steps for increasing the supply of appropriate and least restrictive services and settings.
- (3) A timeline for increasing the supply of appropriate and least restrictive services and settings.
- (4) The estimated costs and staffing to fully implement the plan.

The report was to be developed in conjunction with LME/MCOs, county departments of social services, Division of Juvenile Justice, NC Healthcare Assn, and other key stakeholders.

Another component of the new law relates to children in the custody of social services who are in emergency departments and require mental health treatment. Timeframes are placed on social services and LME/MCOs to respond, authorize and find placements for children in emergency departments who need mental health treatment. A DHHS Rapid Response Team will coordinate an action plan that includes identifying an appropriate level of care and provider. Finally, a section of the law addresses the payment to hospitals for continued care of a juvenile when there is not medical necessity and while a placement is being identified.

#### The new law also covers areas such as:

- Authority granted for legislators and legislative committees to request and receive confidential information on a custody case;
- Departments of social services have 30 days after the initial order removing custody to identify and notify adult relatives and other persons with legal custody of a sibling of the juvenile;
- Allows the court to consider placement with a former foster parent or nonrelative kin;
- States that the first observation visit should occur within 30 days of the hearing and will be conducted seven days apart;
- States that a drug screen alone is insufficient to deny the parent court-ordered visitation with the juvenile—social services will be required to take additional steps;
- Adds permanency planning to the review conducted by the courts within 90 days from the date of the initial dispositional hearing;
- Allows any person with whom the child has been placed the opportunity to speak to the court about the child's well-being;
- Adds to foster parent training about their responsibilities in judicial proceedings;

- Adds parameters around safe notification if the director [of social services] determines
  the child is a victim of human trafficking by someone other than parent, caregiver or
  quardian;
- Requires development and submission of a plan to the legislature by 9/22 to develop a Child Protective Services hotline;
- Requires public schools to provide students with information and resources on child abuse and neglect, including sexual abuse.

## **Standard Plan Timeframe for Choosing new PHP Ends:**

Standard Plans began on July 1, 2021 and the 90-day clock for changing your PHP without a reason also began. September 30<sup>th</sup> marked the last day that a Standard Plan member could change PHPs without a reason. Now, Standard Plan member can change their health plan for only certain reasons:

- At the time of the Medicaid recertification
- If the member is required to change health plans
- If the member has a special or "with cause" reason that includes: moving out of the health plan's service area, have a family member in a different health plan, all related services needed from providers in the Standard Plan are not available and there is a risk to getting the services separately, the member has a complex medical condition that is better served through another health plan, the member's long-term services and supports provider is not in the health plan, the health plan doesn't cover a service needed for moral or religious reasons, certain other reasons (see "Get Answers" for more information)

## Leandro Follow-Up:

The Commission on Access to a Sound Basic Education adopted a resolution on September 28<sup>th</sup>, "to urge all state bodies, entities, and agencies to take all necessary actions to implement and fund the State's Plan, and in accordance with the timelines and resources set forth therein.
